

Brave Jewel of Honor Maharaja Surajmal Ji

Veer Shiromani Maharaja Surajmal, a skilled leader and administrator who is remembered as a great warrior. He fought for the protection of our country with giving befitting reply to invading enemies. With the establishment of a powerful and prosperous Bharatpur kingdom, Maharaja Surajmal holds a significant place in Indian history. His leadership and role in protecting the sovereignty of his people earned him great admiration. The Bharatpur Kingdom under his rule became a powerful and influential entity in northern India. Born in 1707, he was son of Raja Badan Singh and Rani Devki. His bravery and leadership from a young age earned him immense respect and admiration in Brij Pradesh. His vision and diplomacy allowed him to carve out a legacy that lasted well beyond his time, and his bravery continues to be remembered and celebrated.



MAHARAJA SURAJMAL
(1707-1763)

Maharaja Surajmal led several successful battles to protect and strengthen the dominance of the Bharatpur Kingdom, securing his legacy as a courageous and farsighted ruler. Maharaja Surajmal maintained a strong and strategic alliance with Maharaja Jai Singh of Jaipur. For the princely throne for Ishwari Singh after his father Jai Singh's death, Maharaja Surajmal supported him into a fierce battle in March 1747 and ensured Ishwari Singh's decisive victory. This triumph established his reputation as a formidable and influential ruler spread across India. More than seven feet tall, extremely strong physical fitness and an expert in using swords with both hands also became famous by the name like 'Jat Plato'. Maharaja Surajmal fought about 80 battles in his lifetime and remained victorious in all of them. These wars included Sarai Somachand in 1750 AD in which he captured Mughal Minister Mir Bakshi Salavatjung, war with Mughal – Maratha in which Peshwa Malharao's son Khanderao lost his life in 1754 AD, war with Ahmed Shah Abdali in 1757 AD are remembered for his incredible courage and remarkable leadership. Following this loss, the Marathas sought peace and made a treaty with Maharaja Surajmal. Surajmal attracted recognition of major kingdoms for his indomitable bravery by subjugating Mevs, while in later years Mughal Emperor Ahmed Shah honoured him with the title of 'Rajendra' for his bravery in conquering the Ruhels.

Maharaja Surajmal's strategic foresight was further demonstrated through the construction of the impregnable Lohagarh Fort whose mud walls were so thick that even heavy cannonballs could not penetrate them. Construction completed in 60 years; this is the only fort in Indian history that remained unconquered despite 13 British attacks. In the year 1805 AD, Lord Lake failed to conquer Lohagarh Fort even after a siege of four months. This is counted among the most humiliating defeat of the British in India.

In the Third Battle of Panipat, the Marathas, led by Sadashivrao Bhau, faced Ahmad Shah Abdali. Initially, Bhau managed to secure an alliance with Maharaja Surajmal who advised Bhau to adopt a defensive and strategic approach. Bhau, however insisted on a more aggressive, direct confrontation with Abdali's forces. Without the support by Maharaja Surajmal, Maratha Army got weakened, contributing to their devastating defeat at Panipat. Surajmal's strategic foresight was proven right in hindsight, highlighting his deep understanding of military tactics and statecraft. The Third Battle of Panipat (1761) resulted in the loss of thousands of Maratha warriors and the collapse of their logistical support. Despite the strained relations,

Surajmal displayed remarkable humanity by arranging medical care and food for the wounded Maratha soldiers. Under Surajmal's leadership, Bharatpur power reached its peak. By 1756, Maharaja Surajmal had established himself as one of the most powerful and influential kings of the time, renowned not only for his vast wealth and expansive kingdom but also for his remarkable administrative and military capabilities.

According to Sayyid Ghulam Hussain:

“Surajmal was the eye and the shining taper of the Jat tribe, a prince who rendered himself famous by his good manners and civil deportment as well as by his conquests and his superior knowledge in the arts of government”.

Under Maharaja Surajmal's leadership, the princely state of Bharatpur expanded significantly, encompassing regions like Dholpur, Agra, Mainpuri, Aligarh, Hathras, Etawah, Meerut, Rohtak, Mewat, Rewari, Gurgaon, and Mathura. His reign came to a heroic end on 25th December 1763, when he attained Veergati (martyrdom) in a battle with Nawab Najibudaula on the banks of the river Hindon. His valour and leadership have been immortalized by the poet Sudan in *Sujan Charitra*, which beautifully recounts his life and achievements. At the time of his death, Surajmal commanded a formidable army of approximately 15,000 cavalry and 25,000 infantries, backed by numerous strong forts. His legacy also lives on through architectural masterpieces like Gopal Bhavan, Suraj Bhavan, and Krishna Bhavan, which stand as enduring symbols of his architectural brilliance, regal grandeur and are a living example of his glory.

His large cenotaph is located in Kusum Sarovar, Govardhan, Uttar Pradesh. His imposing chattri is flanked on either side by two smaller chattris of his two wives, "Hansiya" and "Kishori". These memorial chattris were built by his son and successor Jawahar Singh. The architecture and carving is in the pierced stone style and the ceiling of cenotaphs are adorned with paintings of the life of Lord Krishna and Suraj Mal. Notable institutes named after him include Maharaja Surajmal Institute of Technology, Delhi, Maharaja Surajmal Brij University, Bharatpur and Surajmal Stadium metro station, Delhi. On 10th May every year "Delhi Vijay Diwas" is celebrated after Maharaja Surajmal conquered Delhi.

Maharaja Surajmal Brij University (MSBU), Bharatpur, is a prominent institution of higher learning in Rajasthan, established under the *Brij University, Bharatpur Act, 2012 (Act No. 6 of 2012)* by the Government of Rajasthan. The University began its academic operations in 2012–13 and was renamed in 2014 to honour Maharaja Surajmal—an iconic figure in Indian history known for his visionary leadership, administrative acumen, and unwavering commitment to justice and education. Located in the culturally rich and historically significant region of Bharatpur, MSBU was conceptualized to serve the academic and developmental aspirations of the Brij area, encompassing the districts of Bharatpur, Dholpur and Deeg.

Admission Process in MSBU for Academic Session 2025-26

General Instructions

1. Courses offered and Interest-wise Selection:

- a) MSBU offers many attractive and career building Courses and Programmes to suit the aptitude and interest of the candidates.
- b) All the courses proposed are in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP)- 2020.
- c) The University offers courses to be pursued for regular mode. Distant/Corresponding/Online learning modes are not allowed.
- d) The students are advised to apply only if the student meets the eligibility criteria for the respective course(s) mentioned in University Admission Prospectus available on University website (www.msbrijuniversity.ac.in).
- e) Applicants can apply for multiple courses but must fill a separate form for each course. Do not apply more than once for the same course.
- f) If the student has appeared in a qualifying examination and the result thereof is awaited, he/she can also apply. However, admission will initially be provisional and will be valid after subsequent release of their qualifying exam's result, merit list by the University, fee submission, document verification, other formalities and approvals.

2. Pre-requisites for filling Application Form

- a) The student is advised to keep soft copies of latest digital passport size photograph (100 kbs) and signature (50 kbs) for filling up the application form.
- b) A valid email address and a functional contact number must be provided as these will be used for all official communication.
- c) The candidate can use payment facility for the registration by online mode via Internet Banking/Debit/Credit card/UPI.

3. Application Form

- a) The Application Form is available online at www.msbuadmission.in. All admission-related updates will be available on the University website, i.e. www.msbrijuniversity.ac.in.
- b) Please read all instructions carefully before filling out the online registration form.
- c) The cost of the registration form is Rs. 500/- for UR/OBC and Rs. 250/- for SC/ST/MBC/EWS/Specially-Abled/Female applicants (Non-Refundable).
- d) Incomplete or incorrect applications will be rejected. Any discrepancy found during document verification may lead to cancellation of admission.
- e) Payment for the registration must be made online via Internet Banking/Debit/Credit card/UPI. Fee may be deposited through payment gateway. The link of payment gateway is provided at online registration form. Applications will be processed only after confirmation of application fee receipt.
- f) Applicants are advised to keep a copy of the completed application form for future reference.
- g) Applications of reserved categories will be considered as per the policies of Government of Rajasthan and directions from the Hon'ble High Court of Rajasthan.

- h) Admission process shall be considered as per rules and provisions of the University Admission Policy 2025-26.
- i) Applicants must regularly check their email/SMS notifications from the University for admission related updates. No separate communication will be sent via post or phone.

4. Admission Formalities

- a) The selected students will be intimated by email/phone call/text message/website notification about their provisional selection after the last date of the application submission through merit-list.
- b) All selected candidates will get information by the Admission Committee regarding submission of the fees, course commencement date and the documents required at the time of document verification for admission.
- c) Offer of admission will be completely merit-based, initially provisional and will be valid for the current Academic Year 2025-26 only after fee submission, document verification and subsequent approvals from the Competent Authorities. The admission offer will automatically stand cancelled if the eligibility, terms & conditions are not fulfilled within the specific time.
- d) Failure to pay the fee or report to the institution for classes after the specified date can entail in cancellation of admission.
- e) There is a possibility that in special cases, the Admission Committee recommends the admission of the candidate in a course for which the applicant may not have applied in the Application Form. In such cases, an option with deep discussions for the betterment of the student will be performed by the Admission Committee members, informing about the change in the course wherein the applicant also gives his/her consent/execute the choice.
- f) Any legal disputes will be subject to the jurisdiction of Maharaja Surajmal Brij University, Bharatpur, i.e. Bharatpur District and Session Court.

UG Programmes

- a) University offers direct admission to graduate programmes, subject to meeting the minimum eligibility criteria.
- b) Admission will be offered as per merit prepared based on the performance of the applicant in Class XII (CBSE/ICSC/State-Boards)
- c) To check the eligibility, aggregate percentage will be calculated on the basis of marks scored in the subjects (compulsorily including subjects of eligibility and excluding Physical Education, Fine Arts, Performing Arts or any Vocational/ Non-Written subjects). These subjects will only be considered for their respective/ selected Programmes.

UG Law Programme (through CLAT score)

- a) Direct Admission will be offered to B.A-LL.B. on CLAT score of 90 and above, subject to meeting the minimum eligibility criteria prescribed for the program.
- b) Applicants who have not appeared in CLAT or have a score <90 can also apply and appear through the University Selection Process.

PG Programmes

University offers direct admission to graduates in Master's Programmes, subject to meeting the minimum eligibility criteria for the respective programmes.

5. Foreign applicants

Eligibility criteria remain same for foreign applicants as applicable for Indian resident applicants.

UG Programmes:

It is mandatory for any foreign applicant to have completed 12 years of formal schooling and he/she must meet the eligibility criteria as prescribed in the admission prospectus.

PG Programmes:

It is mandatory for any foreign applicant to have 12 years of formal education at the school level followed by a bachelor's degree of minimum 3 years duration.

Notes:

- i. In absence of English subject, candidates should have cleared TOEFL with score of 60 out of 120 in iBT or a band of 6.5 in IELTS to get admitted in UG and PG courses.
- ii. Academic transcripts must be translated in certified English language listing all the courses with grades or marks earned to get admitted in UG and PG courses. Transcripts in languages other than English will not be accepted.

Essential Requirements:

Every Foreign Degree/Diploma/Certificate holder must obtain/have the following documents:

- a) AIU/AICTE/UGC equivalence certificate (the responsibility of obtaining AIU Equivalence Certificate is on the candidate and application will be considered only after the Equivalence Certificate is submitted).
- b) Every Foreign Degree/Diploma/Certificate holder must have Degree/Diploma/Certificate along with the year wise Academic Transcript duly forwarded by their Embassy in the Country or concerned Foreign Mission in India.
- c) Accreditation status of the University/Institute which the student has last attended must be provided by the applicant.
- d) Copies of the academic Certificates from Higher Secondary onwards (wherever necessary)
- e) Student Visa should be endorsed in the name of Maharaja Surajmal Brij University, Bharatpur for joining full time programme. No other endorsement will be accepted. The Visa should be valid for the prescribed duration of the course.
- f) Adequate Medical Insurance Cover is must.
- g) Registration with the concerned District Foreigners Registration Office/Foreigners Regional Registration Office within 14 days of their first arrival in India. The students should contact the academic office immediately on arrival in the University Campus for Foreigners Registration Officer (FRO) registration process. No fee is charged for registration, but a penalty in Indian currency

equivalent to US\$ 50 in case of late registration is charged by FRO. The following documents are required at the time of registration with the FRO:

- Original and Photocopy of Passport and Visa
- Four recent passport size Photographs
- Details of Residence in India (Rent Agreement)
- HIV/AIDS & COVID Test Report from one of the WHO recognized Institutions
- Provisional Admission Letter from Maharaja Surajmal Brij University, Bharatpur in support of the student visa.

Note:

Foreign students admitted at MSBU shall not be permitted to engage themselves in Tabligh work. There will be no restriction in visiting religious places and attending normal religious activities like attending religious discourses. However, preaching religious ideologies, making speeches inside the campus, distribution of audio and visual display/ pamphlets pertaining to religious ideologies, spreading conversion etc. will not be allowed.

6. Admission through Lateral Entry

The University offers admission through Lateral entry in third or fifth semester depending on the duration of offered Programmes.

7. Admission to Ph.D. Programmes

Notification for the admission in Ph.D. programmes will be published separately as per the availability of seats in respective subjects.

8. Guidelines for Withdrawal

Requests for withdrawal are required to be initiated through applications submitting to the Admission Cell of the University. If student who is offered University scholarship decides to withdraw, he/she will be treated as a non-scholarship student and the withdrawal guidelines will be applicable in view of UGC regulations.

9. Measures for Anti-Ragging

Ragging is totally banned in the University campus including its departments, affiliated colleges, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private. Anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately as per University guidelines, UGC & State Govt. provisions.

10. Visiting Programmes

All students at the University have an option to avail a 6-week Study in renowned Universities/ Institutions across the globe if they fulfil the required eligibility for application. The University is

not liable for any expenses/expenditure for travel, accommodation or similar requirement by the candidate.

11. Scholarships

For UG Programmes:

- i. MSBU offers scholarship at UG level to the eligible candidates and is based on the marks obtained by the candidate in class XII.
- ii. The criteria for claiming the scholarship is mentioned below:

For PG Programmes:

- i. MSBU offers scholarship at PG level to the eligible candidates and is based on the marks obtained by the candidate in graduation.
- ii. The criteria for claiming the scholarship is mentioned below:

20%	75% - 79.99% in Graduation

Notes:

1. Grant of Scholarship in UG and PG programmes is applicable after joining the program, submission of fees and verification of original documents.
2. Scholarship is granted on annual basis on the first year in tuition fees only. However, the student will be required to pay the full semester fee initially. The excess amount accruing due to scholarship will be adjusted against payment for next semester.

Sports Scholarship

1. University offers Sports Scholarship to talented Sports person.
2. To claim the scholarship, it is mandatory that the candidate meets the minimum academic eligibility for the program.
3. Sports Scholarship is granted by selection process, interview & sports trials along with evaluation of sports certificates at National and International levels as following:

- iii. Asian Games by Olympic Council of Asia.
- iv. Asian Championship organized by International Federation of concerned game (recognized /affiliated by MYAS and/ or IOA).
- v. Commonwealth Games, South Asian Federation (SAF) Games and Afro-Asian Games.
- vi. Paralympics Games (recognized/ affiliated by IOC and/ or MYAS).

Notes:

1. *All candidates selected under sports scholarship will have to submit an affidavit stating that they will participate/ represent only from MSBU.*
2. *Grant of Sports Scholarship will be based on performance in their sports trial which will be monitored by University Sports Committee.*
3. *Students will be required to pay the full fees initially. The excess amount accruing due to scholarship will be adjusted against payment for Semester-II.*

Martyr's Scholarship

Martyr's scholarship is offered to the wards of deceased soldiers in recognition of the services rendered to the nation. It is mandatory to meet the minimum academic eligibility of the respective program and to appear in the prescribed selection process.

- 100% Scholarship will be given to selected students based on the scrutiny of Scholarship committee.
- The applicants must support their application with documentary evidence justifying the scholarship.
- The Scholarship will be given to the eligible candidates who have qualified for a programme through the admission process and admitted to the University.

Wards of Martyrs from any of the following organizations are eligible for Scholarship:

Army	Special Frontier Force	ITBP (Indo-Tibetan Border Police)
Navy	Indian Coast Guard	CISF (Central Industrial Security Force)
Air force	CRPF (Central Reserve Police Force)	SSB (Sashastra Seema Bal)

Notes:

1. Full fee has to be paid initially at the time of admission. Scholarship amount will be adjusted in the payment of next semester.
2. Scholarship is granted on annual basis for the first year.

Alumni & University Staff Benefit

The wards of University Alumni and staff are eligible for 10% Fee concession. However, there should not be a gap of more than two years in last passed degree.

Important Notes for Scholarships:

1. Grant of Scholarship is subject to approval of Scholarship Committee.
2. Student cannot claim combination of scholarship and concession. Only one type of Scholarship/Concession can be availed. (Whichever is higher)
3. Students will be required to pay the full fees initially in all categories of scholarship. The excess amount accruing due to scholarship will be adjusted against payment for Semester-II.
4. Scholarship is adjusted in tuition fee only. No extra amount is awarded to the student.
5. In all categories of Scholarship, limited scholarship seats are available and granted on merit basis.
6. Scholarship of any category does not include University funds, Local funds, security deposit, boarding and lodging cost.
7. In the absence of complete details in prescribed format and required relevant documents/certificates, scholarship application will not be considered and will stand cancelled.
8. Scholarship is not applicable to Ph.D. Programmes.

Other important Notes:

1. The student should strictly abide by the rules and regulations of the University as applicable time to time.
2. Following the enrolment, if the student is found stating incorrect information/concealed any fact/used any fraudulent means, the student shall be liable for disciplinary actions and cancellation of his/her admission in the University without any prior information. The student shall accept any decision/action taken by the University against him/her.
3. The student must understand that the University holds the right to run or cancel any course/programme as approved by the Competent Body of the University.
4. A person convicted and sentenced imprisonment of any duration for any unlawful activity will not be able and eligible to apply for admission in any course offered by the University.

RESERVATION POLICY

1. Reservation of seats/relaxation of marks for S.C., S.T., OBC, MBC, Economically Weaker Section (EWS), and Physically Handicapped (PH) Candidates: will be as per the policy of Government of Rajasthan.
 - A. 49% of the total number of seats in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies, Education (including Honours, Pre-Professional, Certificate/ Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) will be reserved in each Department for NATURAL BORN sons/ daughters of parents belonging to Scheduled Castes (16%), Scheduled Tribes (12%), OBC except creamy layer (21%).
 - B. 5% of the total number of seats in each category and each course in the faculties specified in (A) above will be reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates defined as Deaf/ Dumb/Blind/Loss of any limb with permanent disability as per reservation policy of the Government of Rajasthan.
 - C. 10% of the total number of seats in each category and each course in the faculties specified in (A) above will be reserved for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
 - D. (i) All Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and OBC candidates who have passed the qualifying examination for admission to a University course may be arranged in order of merit within the category to which they belong.
(ii) Those who have secured marks above the level up to which the general category students are admitted, they should not be counted towards reserved quota at all and should be included in the General Merit List of admissions.
(iii) Excluding those admitted on merit along with general candidates as at (ii) above, other Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe candidates should be admitted in the order of merit going down the inter-se merit list up to the point necessary to secure adequate number of candidates to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes to fulfil the reservation percentage completely.
(iv) It is clarified that in order to fill the reservation quota for SC, ST and OBC, MBC candidates, there should be no hesitation to go down, if necessary, to the pass percentage of the qualifying examination (e.g. class XII, for admission to B.A./B.Sc. /B.Com/ BBA/BCA Pass Course as well as Honours Part I and Bachelor's Degree for admission to a Post Graduate course, and so on).
 - E. 5% of the total number of seats in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies and Education (including Honours, Pre- Professional, Certificate/ Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) will be reserved in each Department for the Most Backward Classes as per policy laid down by the Government of Rajasthan vide letter no. F-18(2) Education-4/2014 Reservation dated 07 March, 2019.
 - F. 10% of the total number of seats in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies and Education (including Honours, Pre-Professional, Certificate/Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) will be reserved in each Department for the Economically Weaker Sections as per policy laid by Government of Rajasthan vide letter no. F-18(2) Education- 4/2014 Reservation dated 07 March, 2019. There is no provision of relaxation ineligibility criteria for EWS Candidates.
 - G. 15% supernumerary seats in all courses will be reserved for International Students including Persons of Indian Origin. Out of the 15% supernumerary seats 1/3rd i.e. 5% seats would be preferably filled by children of NRIs, on payment of five times the fee payable by a regular student of the same course.
 - H. For Transgender, Outright Admission may be given in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies and Education (including Honours, Pre Professional, Certificate/ Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) subject to submission of a Government Certificate from the competent authority approved as per the latest directives for admission of transgender person in higher education.

Notes:

- (i) Candidates belonging to S.C., S.T., and OBC, MBC, EWS category will be required to produce a certificate to that effect from a District Magistrate/ Tehsildar/ Sub- Divisional Magistrate, without which their cases will not be considered under the provision, and as per directions of the State Government. Validity of Certificates will be as per rules of the Government of Rajasthan. For Most Backward Classes and Economically Weaker Sections the validity of Certificates will be as per the Government of Rajasthan.
- (ii) Candidates claiming concession under clause (B) above shall be required to furnish a certificate in original from the Principal Shree Jagannath Pahadiya Medical College, Bharatpur or S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur/ Director, Rehabilitation Research Centre/ Head of the Department concerned of Shree Jagannath Pahadiya Medical College, Bharatpur or S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur.
- (iii) A relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum percentage of marks for admission under the provision (B) shall be admissible to Physically Handicapped candidates defined as deaf/dumb/blind/loss of any limb with permanent disability. Such cases will be screened and cleared by a Central Committee constituted for this purpose. No other concession or weightage of marks on any other score whatsoever shall however, be admissible to them.

O-81-III Concessions for Purposes of Admission

- (i) Weightage of marks will be given while preparing the merit list only if the candidates has secured the minimum percentage of marks prescribed, if any for admission to the courses;
- (ii) Achievement in N.C.C. and Scouting/ Roving at the school level are valid only for under-graduate admissions and those at the college level for postgraduate/Law admissions, only once;
- (iii) The concession of marks under the various clauses of this ordinance will be given to a candidate to his/her advantage under any one of the clauses and not under more than one clause;
- (iv) For the purpose of this ordinance only Sports Board/Committee, Maharaja Surajmal Brij University sports/games shall be recognized. Certified copies of Certificates should be attached to the application form for admission and shall not be entertained subsequently;
- (v) If a student who has been given admission on the basis of concession as mentioned above does not appear on the University play grounds/courts for a regular practice, his admission may be cancelled at the discretion of the Head of the Institution concerned.
- (vi) In the interest of the Institution, the Head of the institution may refuse the above concessions. He may also refuse admission if he is doubtful about the authenticity of the certificate and or about the candidate's conduct.
- (vii) Claiming for 5% and above weightage in sports for UG and PG admission, students have to report at University Sports Board/Committee for his skill performance and physical efficiency test in proper sports kit with original certificates.

Ordinance 81-IV

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Ordinances prescribing minimum percentage of marks for admission to the various courses of study, the Head of an Institution may fix a higher minimum percentage of marks "for students other than those belonging to SC/ST category" for regulating admission in the Institute concerned. Provided that a relaxation of 5% in the minimum percentage of marks prescribed for admission under the above provisions shall be admissible to Physically Handicapped candidates defined as deaf/ dumb/blind/loss of any limb with permanent disability. No other concession or weightage in marks on any other score whatsoever shall, however, be admissible to them.

The following Concessions shall be admissible to the outstanding players and athletes seeking admission to the various courses of study in the Faculties of Arts, Commerce, Education, Fine Arts, Law, Management, Science and Social Sciences.

- A. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for admission to a course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination(s) provided they fulfil the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances:
- i. Those who have been sponsored by the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare to represent the Nation in Games & Sports in International Tournaments.
 - ii. Those who have been sponsored by the Inter University Sports Board to represent the Indian Universities in Games and sports in World University Games/tournaments.
 - iii. Those who have been members of the University teams in games and sports which have been declared First, Second and Third Position in the All India Inter University tournaments under the auspices of the Association of Indian Universities.
 - iv. Those who have represented the state school in games and sports in School Games Federation of India (SGFI).

- B. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 7% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list for admission to a course. Those who have represented the University in games and sports in the All India Inter University Tournaments held under the auspices of the Association of Indian Universities.
- Winner/Runners-up in the West Zone Inter University Tournaments.
 - Position in Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (K.V.S.)/ National/ Navodaya Vidyalaya Sangathan (N.V.S.) / National/ IPS National Tournament/Sainik School National Tournaments.
 - Position in Rajasthan state School Games Tournaments.
- C. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 5% of the total aggregate of the marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list. This weightage will also be taken into consideration towards the fulfilment of the minimum requirement for admission prescribed, if any by the Head of an Institution under the provisions of the University Prospectus.
- Those who have represented the University in games and sports in the Inter University (zone). Tournaments held under the auspices of the Association of Indian Universities.
 - Participation in Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (K.V.S.)/National/Navodaya Vidyalaya Sangathan (N.V.S.) National/ IPS National/ CBSE National/ Sainik School National Tournament.
 - Participation in Rajasthan School State Games Tournaments.
 - Position in CBSE Zonal/Cluster Tournaments.
- D. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 4% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list for admission to a course.
- Position in K.V.S. Regional/ Position in N.V.S. Regional/ Position in IPS Regional or Cluster/Position in Rajasthan School District Tournaments.
 - Position in Inter Colleges tournament organised by University Sports Board.
 - Position in the All-India Sanskrit Inter University tournaments.
- E. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 2% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list for admission to a course.
- Those who have represented their respective schools in K.V.S. Regional/ N.V.S. cluster/ Regional/IPS Regional, Cluster/ Rajasthan District schools Tournaments.
 - Those who have represented their respective colleges in games and sports at the Inter - Collegiate tournaments held under the auspices of the University Sports Board.
 - Participation in the All-India Sanskrit Inter University tournaments.

Notes:

- The weightage of the achievements at School level will be given only at Graduate Courses admission.
- For PG admissions the weightage will be only given for the achievements during the graduation courses.
- Weightage will be given to only those certificates of games & sports which he/she has participated at least once in the immediately preceding two years.
- For the purpose of claiming the above concessions, the certificates submitted have to be countersigned by the Head of the Institution.
- For the purpose of claiming the above weightage, the applicant has to submit School/College and such other relevant certificate(s) to prove the link of his representation up to that level.
- The weightage will be given only for those games & Sports, which are approved in Sports Board, Maharaja Surajmal Brij University, Bharatpur. Weightage will not be given to any open competitions like district/ State/ National, Women sports, Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan, Rural Sports, PYAKA etc.

Co-Curricular Activities (National Jamboori/ NSS/ Army)

1. Reservation will be applied to those:

- (i) Candidates sponsored by the Ministry of Education and `Social Welfare and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India to represent the Nation in Co-curricular activities at the International level. They shall be eligible for admission to the course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination provided they fulfil the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances.
- (ii) The volunteers who are awarded with National Service Scheme National Award provided they produce original link certificate for verification.

2. A Weightage of 4% will be given to those:

Who completed 240 hours of service (in two consecutive sessions) along with participation in at least one Republic Day Parade camp organized by Ministry of Defence for the Rajpath in Delhi and one national level camp with relevant state level and Unit level link certificates.

3. A Weightage of 2% will be given to those:

Who completed 240 hours of service (in two consecutive sessions) along with two National level camps i.e. National youth festival/National interaction camp/Adventure camp/Prawasi Bhartiya Divas (in two consecutive sessions), with state level/ Mega camp and two special camp (two consecutive sessions) as link certificates.

4. A Weightage of 1.5% will be given to those:

Who completed 240 hours of service (in two consecutive sessions) along with one National level camp with state level/ Mega camp and two special camps (two consecutive sessions) as link certificates.

5. A Weightage of 1% will be given to those:

Who completed 240 hours of service (in two consecutive sessions) along with one state level/ Mega camp and two special camp (two consecutive sessions) as link certificates.

6. A Weightage of 0.5% will be given to those:

Who completed 120 hours of service along with one state level/ Mega camp and one special camp as link certificates.

7. Albino candidates will be given a weightage of 1%.

8. Military personnel or his wards and Paramilitary personnel or his wards (B.S.F., CRPT, SSB, ITBP, CISF) will be given 5% weightage after verification of certificate.

9. Wards of Shahid Military and Paramilitary forces (B.S.F., CRPT, SSB, ITBP, CISF) will be given outright admission.

NCC

A. (i) N.C.C. Cadets representing the Nation in any activity sponsored by the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare/ Defence/ D.G., N.C.C. Delhi, shall be eligible for admission to the course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination, provided they fulfil the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances.

(ii) All India Best Cadet Award (Girls/Boys) Army, Navy, Air Force, S.D., J.D. will be eligible for outright admission as per the above clause.

B. Weightage of 5% marks of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination will be given to those N.C.C. cadets who have completed one or more of the following:

(i) R.D. Camp/TSC/VSC/NSC (Note: 1% marks over and above the 5% marks will be given to those cadets getting 1st and 2nd prizes in any event at the R.D. Camp/TSC/VSC/NSC)

(ii) All India Advanced Leadership Camp.

(iii) Para Jumping Course (Note: 1% marks over and above the 5% marks will be given to those cadets completing the Sky Diving Course).

(iv) Basic Mountaineering Course or participation in D.G., N.C.C. organized Mountaineering Expeditions on peaks which are 20,000 feet and above (Note: 1% marks over and above the 5% marks will be given to those

N.C.C. Cadets completing the Adventure Mountaineering and Advanced Mountaineering Course).

- (v) "C" Certificate for boys and girls who have attained 'B' grading (Note: 1% marks over and above 5% marks will be given to cadets getting 'A' grade).
 - (vi) Snow Skiing Course.
 - (vii) A Certificate with 'B' grading in Junior Division N.C.C.
 - (viii) A cadet who has achieved the rank of Senior Under Officer/Senior Cadet Captain/Cadet Senior Under officer.
- C. Weightage of 3% marks of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination will be given to those N.C.C. cadets who have completed one or more of the following:
- (i) All India Summer Training Camp (Army, Navy and Air force).
 - (ii) "C" Certificate for Boys and Girls with a "C" grading.
 - (iii) "B" certificate with B grading (Note: 1% marks over and above 3% marks will be given to cadets getting "A" grade).
 - (iv) All India Basic Leadership Course.
 - (v) Attendance with the Regular Army/ Navy/Air Force for a minimum period of 10/12 days (10 days Camp-ATC/ CATC/NIC/EBSB/RCTC etc. attended organized by NCC).
 - (vi) Water Skiing Course.
 - (vii) A certificate for Boys and Girls with "C" grading in the Junior Division N.C.C.
 - (viii) A cadet who has achieved the rank of U.O./C.U.O/ Cadet Captain.
 - (ix) "B" certificate for boys and Girls with "C" Grading.
 - (x) Rock Climbing Course.
 - (xi) Participation in competitions/activities held after selection by the Group Commander and organized under the auspices of N.C.C. Directorate, Rajasthan.
 - (xii) A cadet who has achieved a Cadets Sergeant's/ Leading Cadet/Sergeant rank.

Scouts/ Guides/ Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides

- A. The following categories of Scouts/ Guides/Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides shall be eligible for admission to a course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination provided they fulfil the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances:
- (i) Those who have been sponsored by the National Headquarters, Bharat Scouts & Guides to represent in International events at least once in the immediately preceding five years. This privilege will be given to those who have been regular members of the Crew/Team for the Last three years.
 - (ii) Those who have been awarded President's Scout/Guide Certificate or President's Rover/Ranger Award by the President of India in the immediately preceding five years.
- B. The following categories of Scouts/ Guides/ Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides shall be eligible for a Weightage of 5% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the Merit List. This weightage will also be taken into consideration towards the fulfilment of minimum requirement for admission prescribed, if any, by the Head of an Institution under the provisions of the University Prospectus:
- "Those who have been sponsored by the State Headquarters, Bharat Scouts and Guides in National Events at least once in the immediately preceding five years. This privilege will be given to only those who have been regular members of the Crew/Team for the last four years i.e. Rover/Ranger Samagam."
- C. A weightage of 3% marks of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the Scouts/Guides/Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides of the following categories:
- (i) Those who have been awarded Rajya Puraskar/Nipun certificate by the Governor/ State Chief Commissioner in the immediately preceding five years.
 - (ii) Those who have attended the Rover Moot/Ranger Meet and their Crew/Team has been awarded at least three standards in the immediately preceding four years.
- D. A Weightage of 2% marks of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination will be

given to the Scouts/ Guides/Rover Scouts/ Ranger Guides of the following categories:

- (i) Those who have been awarded Ramblers Badge/ Disaster Management Badge/Community Worker Badge/Rural worker Badge and Certificate in the immediately preceding four years.
- (ii) Those who have participated in District/ Divisional/ State level scout camp/and other competitions in the immediately preceding three years.
- (iii) Those who have attended an Adventure Camp at the National/ State level in the immediately preceding three years.
- (iv) Those who have attended the Rover Mate/ Ranger Mate training camp at the State level in the immediately preceding three years.
- (v) Those who have rendered 240 hours Community Social Service in the immediately preceding two years.
- (vi) Those who have contributed at least 50% individually in getting the Prime Minister's Shield/Uprashtrapati Shield Certificate in the immediately preceding two years.
- (vii) Those who have attended Rover/ Ranger Training Camp at the Divisional/State level in the immediately preceding four years.
- (viii) Those who have contributed at least 50% individuality in achieving Standard of Fourteen-point Programme of the Rajasthan State Bharat Scouts & Guides in the immediately preceding two years.
- (ix) A weightage of 1% marks of the total aggregate of the marks prescribed for the qualifying examination will be given to the Scouts/ Guides/ Rover Scouts/ Ranger Guides of the following categories:
 - (a) Those who have been awarded Tertiya Sopan/Praveen Certificate duly countersigned by the Assistant Organizing Commissioner/ State Organizing Commissioner.
 - (b) Those who have rendered 120 hours Community Social service in the immediately preceding one year.

Mountaineering

The following weightage of marks shall be given to the candidates who have taken part in Mountaineering:

- (i) Basic Course in Mountaineering 1% organised by University/Recognised Institutes.
- (ii) Advanced Course in Mountaineering 2% organised by University Recognized Institutes.
- (iii) Adventure Programmes organised by 3% University or the Ministry of Education and reached 20,000 ft. height or above.
- (iv) National Representation in International 5% Expeditions.

Note: Subject to the provision of clauses B and F above:

Defence Personnel

The wards of such defence personnel of state domicile who were killed in action shall be admitted irrespective of merit provided they fulfil the eligibility conditions laid down for the course. The seats shall be limited to 3% of total seats on supernumerary basis.

Concessions for the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants

The following concession shall be admissible to the wards of Kashmiri Migrants as per direction of Government of India.

- (i) Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement;
- (ii) Increase in intake capacity up to 5% course wise;
- (iii) Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions;
- (iv) Waiving of domicile requirements.

Concessions for the son/daughter/Grandson/Grand-daughter of Freedom Fighter

According to Rule 10 of the Rajasthan Freedom Fighters Samman Service Rules 1959, there is a provision to not pay school, college fees to the sons, daughters and grandchildren of freedom fighters.

Reservation will be made only as per Government policy (i.e. S.C.-16%, S.T. 12%, OBC 21% and PH 5%, MBC 5% & EWS 10% in each course)






Constitution Park

A Constitution Park on a University campus functions as a cultural and educational hub, aimed at promoting understanding of the Indian Constitution. It typically includes elements like a Constitution Pillar engraved with the Preamble, Fundamental Rights, and Duties, as well as statues of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, father of Indian constitution and first Prime Minister of India Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru.

Maharaja Surajmal Statue

Maharaja Surajmal Brij University (MSBU) in Bharatpur, Rajasthan, pays homage to its namesake through a distinguished statue and a specially designed park on campus. The bronze equestrian statue (21 feet) of Maharaja Surajmal honours his leadership and significant impact on the region. The adjacent lush green park offers a peaceful sitting for both students and visitors, blending historical remembrance with the beauty of nature. This area not only commemorates the legacy of the Maharaja Surajmal but also functions as an important cultural and educational feature of the University.



Helipad

MSBU is the only state government University in Rajasthan that is enriched with the helipad facility. It serves as a vital infrastructure for facilitating & enabling quick air transportation, particularly for emergency situations and visits by dignitaries. It may also contribute to aviation-related academic programs by offering hands-on experience with helicopter operations. Hostel


