



Dr. Arun Kumar Pandey, Deputy Registrar greeted all the members and requested the Vice Chancellor and Chairperson of the Academic Council for his opening remarks and progress made by the University since the last Academic Council meeting.

In his opening remarks, the Vice Chancellor and Chairperson of the Academic Council welcomed and all members and expressed his gratitude for the academic cooperation and contribution provided by the members till the date.


Afterwards, the Vice Chancellor and Chairperson of the Academic Council apprised the Academic Council about the agenda of the meeting regarding academic developments that

took place after the last meeting of the Academic Council. The Vice Chancellor briefly narrated the significant developments in the University since the last Board of Management meeting. Sh. Prashant Kumar, the convener of the meeting, placed and read out all the agenda items before the members of the Academic Council with full description wherever needed. Sh. Nishant recorded the minutes of the meeting.

After opening remarks of the Vice Chancellor and Chairperson of the Academic Council, the Academic Council transacted the following work -

Item No. 1	To confirm the Minutes of the 16 <sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 01 <sup>st</sup> May 2024 and to note the Action Taken thereon.
Resolution No. 1	The members confirmed their agreements to the minutes of the 16th meeting of the Academic Council held on 01st May 2024
Item No. 2	To report and approve the syllabi of different courses and Value Added Courses/Skill Enhancement Courses (VAC/SEC) drafted by the concerned Board of Studies (BOSs), the syllabi of the University campus courses started from the academic session 2024-25 and onwards as per the National Education Policy (NEP).
Resolution No. 2	In the meeting, the Academic Council approved that Value Added Courses/Skill Enhancement Courses (VAC/SEC) as adopted from University of Rajasthan, Jaipur may be continued for the session 2024-25. From next academic session i.e. 2026-27, all these syllabi be framed by the BOS of concerned subjects. The syllabi of the University campus courses be framed by BOS of concerned subjects from the next session. The compiled syllabi of different courses for the academic session 2024-25 were presented to the Academic Council for a detailed review which were then thoroughly discussed about relevance, rigor, and structure of the courses. The Academic Council suggested to ensure that the syllabi are aligned with the guidelines and framework provided by the NEP, and to verify that the syllabi are up-to-date and meets the academic and industry standards.  Further, it was suggested by the members that meetings of BOS of all subjects must be conducted latest by 31 <sup>st</sup> May for upcoming session (2025-26) and thereafter be presented before next Academic Council.  <i>Action: Academic Department of the University &amp; Academic Campus</i>
Item No. 3	To report and approve that about 316 research scholars have been registered in academic sessions 2023-24 & 2024-25 commenced simultaneously following University Grants Commission (UGC) norms and University Ordinance. To enhance the quality, updation and novelty of the research and to ensure global recognition, it is proposed to allocate research supervisors/guides affiliated from renowned National and International Universities (wherever necessary), in addition to the supervisors/guides available in the University jurisdiction.
Resolution	The details of 316 research scholars were presented to the Academic Council. The


 

No. 3	<p>Academic Council verified that the research scholars are registered following UGC guidelines and University ordinance. The proposal stating the allocation of supervisors/guides available within the University jurisdiction, along with the supervisors/guides from renowned national and international universities as per the necessity was supported by the members. Academic Council added that this approach will promote interdisciplinary and high-impact research, enhancing the visibility and credibility of research work on a global platform.</p> <p>The members suggested ensuring the compliance of the latest guidelines of UGC in this regard and also as per the University research ordinance, regular guides are available; they shall be recognized as guide/ supervisors only. In case of emergency, if any regular guide/supervisor is unable to guide/supervise a scholar, University teachers appointed at contractual basis may be recognized as co-guide/supervisor.</p> <p>Further, it was suggested that a committee has to be constituted for the scrutiny of the application forms received for registering teachers as research supervisors. The committee may comprise as follows :-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Prof. M.K. Singh, Principal, Govt. College, Bari, Dholpur.</li> <li>2. Prof. Sujata Chauhan, Principal, R.D. Girls College, Bharatpur.</li> <li>3. Prof. Mamta Verma, Principal, Govt. College, Saipau, Dholpur.</li> <li>4. Prof. Yogendra Bhanu, M.S.J. College Bharatpur.</li> <li>5. Prof. Satish Trigunayat, Rt. from College Education, Rajasthan.</li> </ol> <p>Applications should be invited for the registration of supervisor for 10 Days with effect from 09-04-2025 to 18-04-2025.</p>
Item No. 4	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Action: Research Division of the University &amp; Research Advisory Board</i></p> <p>To report and record the matter of Sri Ganga Sharan Girls College, Bharatpur to revoke the de-affiliation orders issued by the University in sake of the academic future of the students of the college in view of reconsideration of the application and the affidavit submitted by the college management regarding fulfilling and complying all affiliation related parameters in due course of time.</p> <p>The college management has also informed the University that it has shifted the college from a rented building to a newly constructed own building and developing the infrastructure as per norms.</p>
Resolution No. 4	<p>The Council is of the opinion that while taking action of de-affiliation of Sh. Ganga Sharan Girls College Bharatpur issued on 22.11.2024, the future of students was not well considered whereas in any matter of de-affiliation it is prime to first safe guard the future of the students. Further, the inquiry report submitted to Raj Bhawan must be showing that prima facie de-affiliation is not proper which is perceived by the order of Raj Bhawan issued in respect with suspension of the Vice Chancellor. Therefore, the council is of the opinion that the de-affiliation may be revoked right now to safe guard the interest of students and the college may be asked to submit affidavit in respect with deficiency compliance. As it is unanimously decided at item no. 10 that the colleges not having NOC of the State Government may submit their NOC by 30<sup>th</sup> of April 2025 failing which their students will either be declared non-collegiate or will be shifted to other colleges as the case may be. Thus, this college is also given the same opportunity with same terms &amp; conditions as detailed in item no. 10. This will also help with meeting out the delay already occurred in respect with session.</p>

Item No. 5	<p style="text-align: right;"><i>Action: Affiliation &amp; Examination Branch</i></p> <p>To report and record the matter of Shri S.N. College, Halena, Bharatpur, to revoke the order of the then Vice Chancellor of the University of transferring its students to the University as the number of the admitted students in all courses and classes were cross checked with the data of examination forms applied and verified by this college are found within the limit of number of seats allotted in all approved courses as the data retrieved from the Pre &amp; Post Exam firm. The college has PNOC of the State Government and must be taken fairly in view of ensuring that the academic interest of the students is involved and they must not be affected adversely by any decision of the University.</p> <p>While the college will be given a fixed time to comply with norms and regulations of the University regarding affiliation.</p> <p>This has been proposed in view and compliance of the Order No. F.44(1)RB/2024/1596 dated 28.03.2025 issued by the Hon'ble Chancellor of the University regarding suspension of Prof. Ramesh Chandra from the post of Vice Chancellor of the University mentioning that the inquiry is pending in the case of the above mentioned college under the chairmanship of Divisional Commissioner, Bharatpur.</p>
Resolution No. 5	<p>In this case, the decision was taken by previous Vice Chancellor to consider the students as University Students without considering the ways and means and number of seats. Further, the committee formed by Raj Bhawan identified it as to be not proper as reflected in order no. F.44(1)RB/2024/1596 dated 28.03.2025 issued by Raj Bhawan in respect with suspension of the Vice Chancellor. Therefore, the Academic Council after detailed discussion decided that since the college has P-NOC and the number of students studying is quite large, therefore, the instruction issued may be revoked and the college may run as usual and may be issued affiliation subject to submission of affidavit in report with compliance of deficiencies. This will also help with meeting out the delay already occurred in respect with session.</p>
Item No. 6	<p style="text-align: right;"><i>Action: Affiliation &amp; Examination Branch</i></p> <p>To report and seek approval for the decision of the University to present its stand clearly and effectively in the ongoing court cases filed in the Hon'ble High Court by affiliated colleges vide writ petitions 15100/2024, 15113/2024, 15622/2024, 9069/2024, challenging the imposition of GST on Affiliation Fee. The University holds right that the colleges will have to pay GST on affiliation fee as demanded by the GST Department.</p>
Resolution No. 6	<p>The cases and details regarding the GST applicability on colleges' affiliation fees charged by the University, as demanded by the GST Department were presented before the Academic Council. After thorough review and consultation, the Academic Council concluded that the University is legally obligated to levy GST on affiliation fees as per the prevailing tax regulations and the affiliated colleges are required to pay GST on affiliation fees as per the demand raised by the GST Department. The Academic Council added that University should present its stand with clarity to Hon'ble High Court, ensuring a robust legal argument in support of the GST levy on affiliation fees. The Academic Council stated that necessary legal representation and documentation must be arranged to defend the University's stance in the aforementioned cases.</p>



	<p>It was also suggested that if the matter prolongs under sub-judication, University must submit GST fee to curtail any penalty cases, if applicable.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Action: Accounts Division, Affiliation Branch and Legal Branch</i></p>
Item No. 7	<p>To report and seek approval for the University decision to consider the mercy application of Sh. Vishnu Kumar S/o Sh. Ranveer Singh (former student of GIMT College, Bharatpur, affiliated to MSBU/Batch 2021) to revoke the decision and orders of withdrawal of his Under Graduate Degree as a three members committee of Government College Teachers has recommended to consider the application of the student quite positively as there was no criminal or forgery case registered against the student during his UG degree course and he was not found indulged in any case of misconduct against the authorities and teachers of the University and his college. Also the committee found that the student Mr. Vishnu Kumar wasn't given any fair chance to present his case and point as he wasn't served any show cause notice by the University administration before withdrawing his UG Degree.</p> <p>Also, Mr. Vishnu Kumar has submitted an affidavit with his mercy application that he would withdraw his litigation filed in the Hon'ble High Court of Rajasthan, Jaipur against the University and that he would not show any desire for any legal action against the University. The committee has also recommended that Mr. Vishnu Kumar must submit in the affidavit that he would withdraw all other previous court cases filed against the University.</p>
Resolution No. 7	<p>The case of degree withdrawal of Sh. Vishnu Kumar was presented and thoroughly discussed with the Academic Council. The Academic Council agreed that the action of degree withdrawal of a student of GIMT college who had passed the course 04 years back, his present social conduct can not be made a basis of such strict action of withdrawing and cancelling his degree in view of a student's career prospects. Also, the Council indicated that the student was not declared 'convicted' in any of police complaints filed against him by the University administration and that the student was never given a Show Cause Notice regarding his conduct.</p> <p>Consequent to the receipt of mercy application by the student, the University formed a committee of senior members of Government Colleges to review the case, the report of committee was also presented before Academic Council, recommending the revoke of withdrawal of Sh. Vishnu Kumar's degree while receiving an affidavit from the student in respect with withdrawal of the case from the court and no further judicial action from his side in any aspect of the case. The Academic Council accepted the report of the committee and in the light of aforesaid facts recommended to revoke the decision of withdrawal and cancellation of Sh. Vishnu Kumar's BA Degree, is approved by the Academic Council and the orders be issued in this regard.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Action: Academic Department, Examination Branch and Legal Branch</i></p>
Item No. 8	<p>To report and approve that admission notice/notification for University Campus Courses for the academic session 2025-26 shall be issued in the last week of April, 2025. It is proposed to be published in significant newspapers. Also to approve the publication of the Admission Bulletin for the academic session 2025-26 of the University mentioning the vision, mission, courses being run in the University,</p>

Resolution No. 8	<p>The Academic Council confirmed their agreement for the proposal that the admission notice/notification for University Campus Courses for the academic session 2025-26 should be issued in the second half of April, 2025. The Academic Council agreed that the publication of the admission notice in significant News Papers will greatly enhance wide publicity and reach to potential candidates. If the research scholar is unable to submit his/her thesis in the stipulated time, the extension of additional 01 year may be granted to submit thesis along with due fee deposition as per norms.
2.	As per UGC Regulations & Guidelines 2009 & 2016 and University Ph.D. Ordinance, allotment of research supervisors to the Ph.D. scholars enrolled in the academic session 2018-19 was completed in the year 2023. Due to severe circumstances of Covid pandemic and

	<p>non-working period, the recognized enlisted mentors who were mentoring and suggesting ways of research to scholars from the approved list of supervisors in the University were subsequently continued as research supervisors of the respective scholars by the DRC held in 2023. The research scholars, whose duration of 06 years has completed now, may be allowed for re-registration as per norms. If the research scholar is unable to submit his/her thesis in the stipulated time, extension of additional 01 year can be granted to submit thesis along with fee deposition as per norms.</p>
3.	<p>Considering COVID-19 as a special condition, special extension of six months duration may be granted by keeping in mind the interest of research scholars and must be granted only for special cases of academic session 2017-18. A period of additional six months may be granted in these cases to submit and complete all the formalities of thesis submission before the award of thesis. There will be no extension afterwards and cannot be considered as an example for future for other cases.</p>
4.	<p>In academic session 2018-19, the cases of six scholars are proposed for special consideration as the DRC's of these scholars are awaited due to non-availability of supervisors in the concerned subjects during the session. Therefore, these cases will be considered in the next DRC with the proposal of their date of registration as the date of allotment of their research supervisors.</p>
5.	<p>All the regular faculties in different colleges affiliated to the university can be allowed to act as supervisor/co-supervisor in their respective subject with immediate effect.</p>

Research scholars will work in the laboratories established at the university specially in the faculty of sciences which require well equipped labs for research.</p>
8.	<p>Those earlier approved guides of university before admission can also be considered as supervisor till the regular faculty is appointed in university. However, in case the main supervisor left or died or refuses then the internal supervisor may be allowed to submit thesis in the interest of institute.</p>



Also, more students were found eligible in some subject as per UGC Guidelines for admission to Ph.D. Programme and they were considered for provisional admission as they meet eligibility criteria after approvals from competent authority.

	17.	Candidates who have already done their coursework whether in M.Phil. Or Ph.D. in the same subject from any other recognized University or Institution is exempted from appearing in coursework and its examination.

The members of the Council thoroughly discussed and recommended that the allotment of research supervisor must be according to UGC guidelines. The Council members agreed with the decisions taken by the research supervisor scrutiny committee as reported by the presented minutes-of-the-meetings. The Council pointed out at recommendation made by the research supervisor scrutiny committee in the meeting held on 20.05.25 that the teachers who are working under the jurisdiction of this University and have applied for their candidature as research supervisor mentioned at S. No. 7, 8, 9 and 10 are required to submit an Undertaking at a plain paper only instead at Non-Judicial Rs. 100/- stamp. The research supervisor scrutiny committee/University is advised to ensure that Dr. Devendra Singh Panwar whose candidature for supervisor has not been taken for positive consideration as he is research Director is Singhania University. Instead, it must be enquired whether he is being paid for this service or not. Decision must be taken in that view.  The Council recommended that teachers of B. Ed colleges who have applied as supervisors may be considered positively if his/her college has been granted affiliation by the University. The teacher will have to submit an Affidavit forwarded by the college administration.

(ii) The Council members suggested that the University must sign MoUs with other State/National level Universities for other purposes but this has to be re-examined in view of present UGC guidelines regarding outsourcing research supervisors through other institutions.

(iii & iv) The members showed their consent for the allotment of research supervisors working in the colleges affiliated by the University if they fulfill the eligibility criteria mentioned in UGC guidelines.

(v) The Council members also recommended to enlist those supervisors with superannuation in near future and suggested to seek their replacement as early as possible. The members added that these supervisors must work and supervise the research scholar as mentioned in the UGC Guidelines- 2022.

(vi) The members of the Council provided their consent to the proposed and nominated colleges as research centers for the conduction of research.

(vii) The members of the Council agreed to the proposal of increasing the number of seats of research scholars under research supervisors for subjects which are lacking available research supervisors according to supernumerary principle. However, the members advised to seeking more research supervisors in such subjects after signing MoUs with various Universities.






